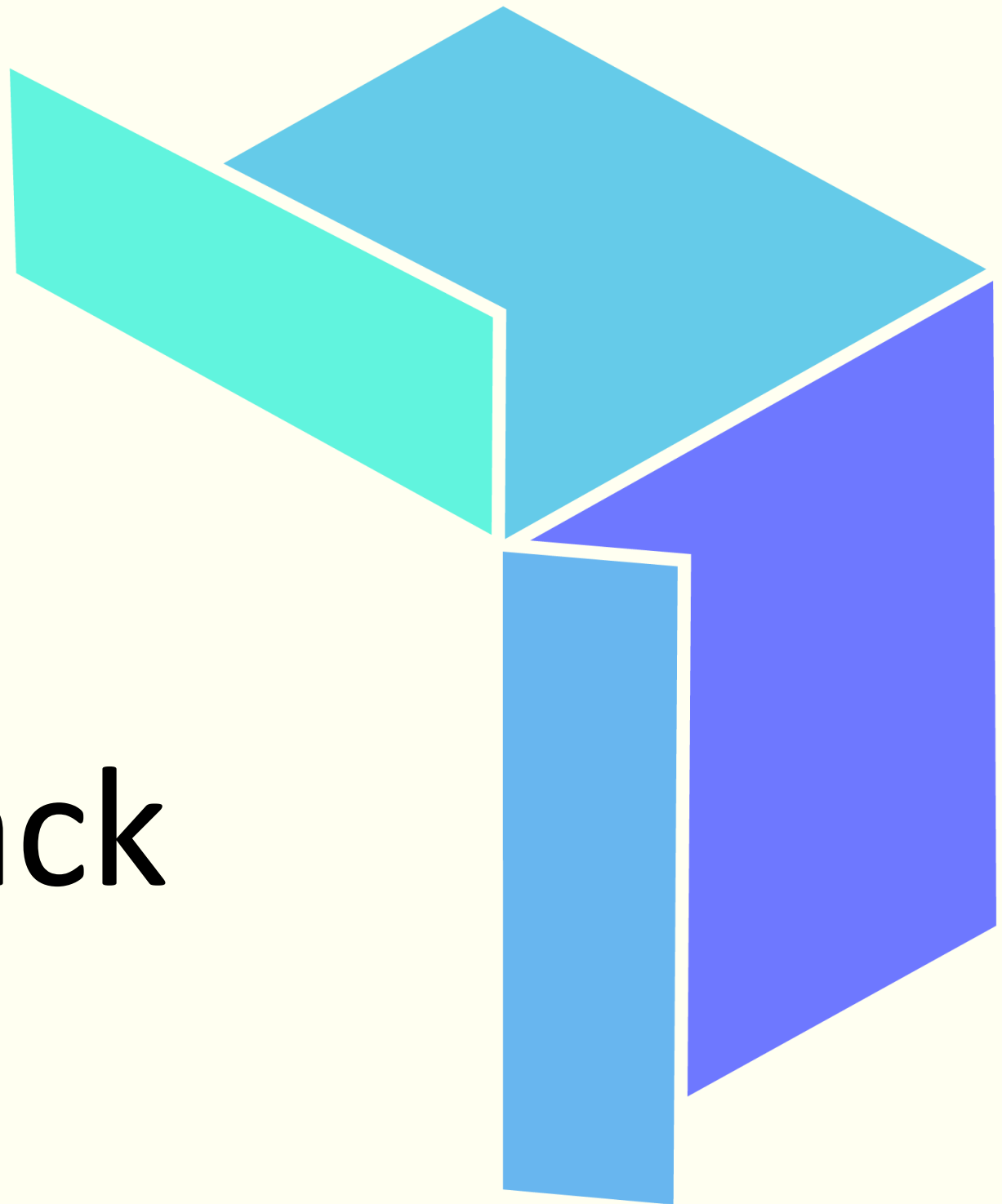

Back-to-Back





Students work in pairs.

Arrange students so they are sitting back-to-back.

Student A should be facing the board. Student B should be facing away from the board.

Student A does not need anything.

Student B will need a mini white board and a pen.

Show a picture or a diagram on the board.

Student A needs to describe what they can see to Student B.

Student B must use what they hear to draw the image from the board on their mini white board.

Student A should not look at what Student B is drawing whilst they are describing.

After an appropriate amount of time (2-5 minutes) turn off the board.

Student A turns to look at the image Student B has drawn.

Student A can use their memory to add or make changes to the image.

Turn the board back on and allow all students to compare their work.

Students should discuss what they did well and what they need to improve.



At the end of the lesson, or at the start of the next lesson, you could ask all students to recreate the picture or diagram that was on the board from memory.
