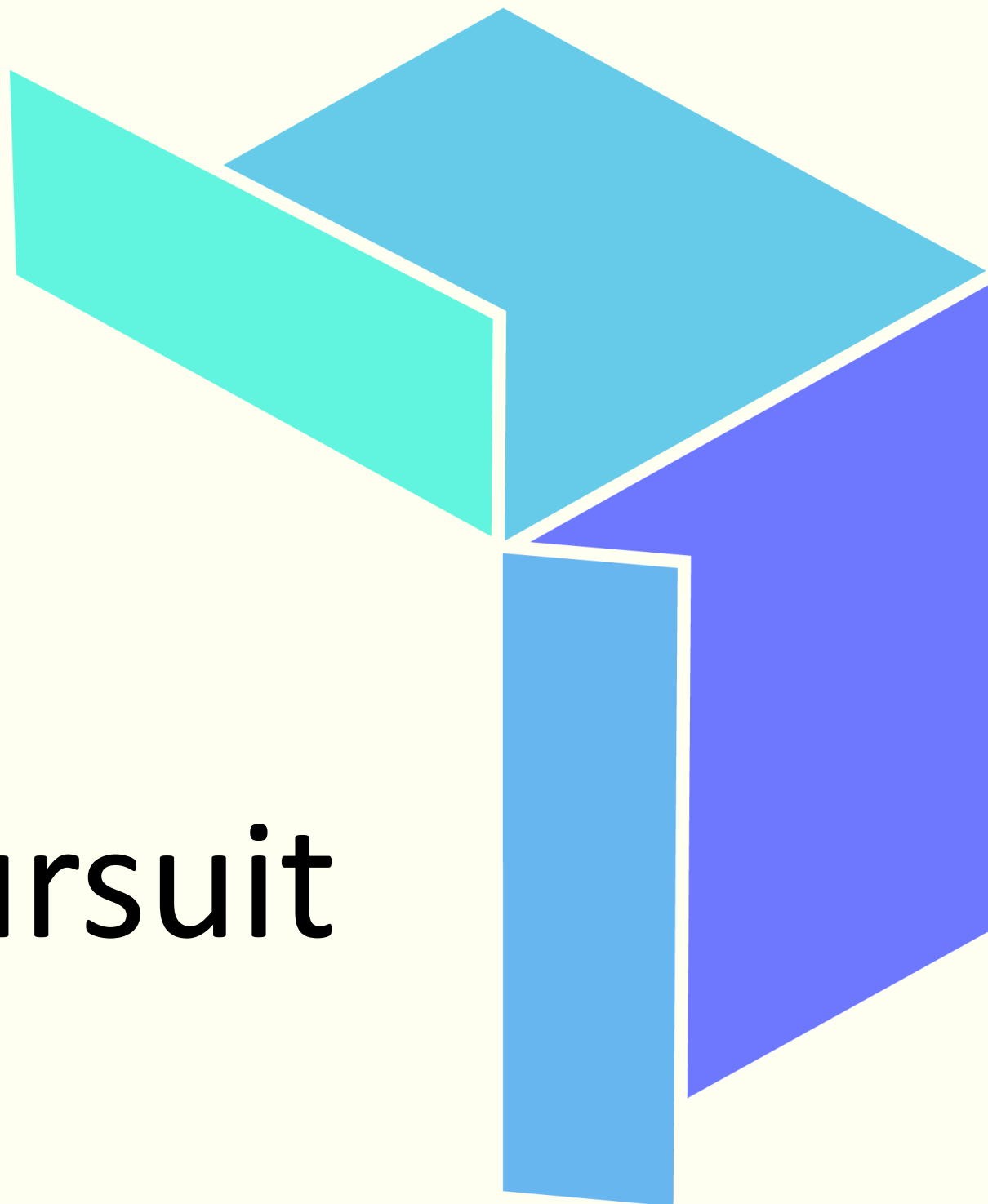

Envelope Pursuit





Prepare 6 A3 envelopes with a different question on each one.

Avoid questions that only yield one-word answers.

Divide the class into 6 groups.

Each group will need 6 post-it notes and a pen.

Give each group a different envelope.

The group should collaborate and write their answer to the question on one post-it note.

After an appropriate amount of time, students should put the post-it note inside the envelope.

Pass the envelope on to the next group in a clockwise direction.

The next group receives the envelope, reads the question and writes their answer on a different post-it note.

After an appropriate amount of time, students put their post-it note into the envelope.

This continues until all 6 groups have completed all 6 envelopes.

The first envelope is returned to the original group.

The group take out all 6 post-it notes from the envelope and use them to create a model answer.

Whilst students are working, visit each group and eliminate any post-it notes that are incorrect.

Make a note of any common misconceptions and be sure to visit these as a class.

Each group will then feedback the model answer to the whole class.

Model answers could be entered onto a shared document, so all students have access.
