Cirque de l'examen






Print off a blank copy of the  
exam paper on A3 paper.  
Aim for one question per  
page if possible.

Scatter the A3 sheets around the room.

Depending on your class size, you may want to print multiple copies.

Students work in pairs, visit each question and write their answers down on the A3 sheet.

After an appropriate amount of time, ask students to move on to the next question.

Students read the responses from previous students and add to, edit or remove answers.

Stick the completed A3 sheets up onto the wall and hand the students back their exam paper.

They can use the Cirque de l'examen around the room to help them make corrections and improvements to their answers.
